ENGINEER'S CORNER

Hello, my name is Chantavoudh Kim and I am the Lead Engineer for the DC Portfolio.

One critical component to the Base building HVAC are Cooling Towers. They are heat removal devices used to transfer process waste heat to the atmosphere. Cooling towers may either use the evaporation of water to remove process heat and cool the working fluid to near the wet bulb air or, in the case of closed circuit dry cooling towers, rely solely on air to cool the working fluid to near the dry bulb air temperature. We clean the towers 2 times a year during Spring and Fall season to keep their optimal efficiencies. In the winter time, you can tell where the cooling towers are located by seeing steam on top of the building roof.

KEEP THE GREEN ALIVE! YOUR CARBON FOOT PRINT MATTERS.



As the leaves are turning color and dropping from the trees, keep the green alive with these practices. Follow these eco-friendly and energy saving tips to have your home ready for when the cold weather comes upon us while shrinking your carbon footprint at the same time!

 \checkmark <u>Turn down the Thermostat</u>: When the weather starts to get cooler, instead of reaching for the thermostat, reach for a sweater. Not only will you save energy you will save money on your utility bills.

✓ <u>Start Composting</u>: Autumn is the perfect time to start composting. Even if you don't have a large yard, you ca still benefit from composting- it enriches soil and reduces the need for water, fertilizer and pesticides.
✓ <u>120- degrees Fahrenheit</u>: Many water heaters default to 140 degrees Fahrenheit when they ship from the manufacturer, but temps that high pose not only high energy costs but scalding risks for your family. Most heater operate efficiently at 120 degrees Fahrenheit. For every 10 degrees you lower the water temperature you can save 3-5 percent in utility costs.
